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### 1. PROGRESS OF RAINY SEASON

The surface position of the Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) (imaginary boundary separating warm and moist winds from dry northerly winds over West Africa) during the dekad was on average above 2 degree latitude north of the Gambia as in the previous dekad, thus resulting to the rains recorded across during the last day of the Dekad (31 May).

### 2. RAINFALL OUTLOOK FOR JUNE 1 - 10, 2013

Cloudy, sunny and humid conditions are expected to prevail accompany with thunderstorms and / or rain during the period.

### 3. RAINFALL SITUATION

During this dekad, rainfall was recorded across the country; however amounts were lowest in the west of the country recording 0.2 to 0.5mm at Banjul and Yundum and highest in the Middle Third, where 32mm was recorded at Sapu. Basse and Fatoto each recorded 4.6 and 16.9mm respectively. Seasonal total varied from 0.2mm to 23.5mm.

Meanwhile, this year's seasonal totals compared to the long-term mean (1981 - 2010) during the same period, deficits ranging from 0.2mm to 8.3mm were observed across the country and surplus of 6.1mm to 27.1mm were equally observed.

### 4. AGROMETEOROLOGICAL SITUATION

Average temperature varied during the dekad between 26.3 °C and 30.8 °C at the Western Third, 31.9 °C and 32.7 °C in the Middle Third and 33.2 °C and 33.6 °C in the Eastern Third of the country. Highest temperatures were between 34 °C and 40 °C in the Western Third, 40.5°C and 42 °C in the Middle Third and 41 °C in the Eastern Third.

Minimum temperatures have increased significantly to a lowest of 19.5 °C at Banjul to 25.5 °C at Janjanbureh.

Average maximum relative humidity (RH) was above 70% and the minimum dropped between 33% around the coast to 11% further inland.

Winds during the dekad were generally moderate to light in speed (37km/hr maximum).

## 5. AGRICULTURAL SITUATION

The dominant on-field activities by farmers continued to be field clearing, acquisition and preparation of seeds. Recent recorded rains will facilitate weeds to grow and will impede farmers, when regular rains start particularly farmers without farm implements.

## 6. SITUATION OF MARKETS

The table below shows cereals, vegetables, fruits, roots and meat was in supply in markets in the Greater Banjul Area, however the prices fluctuate from one market to another.
